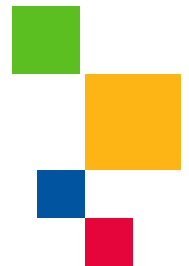

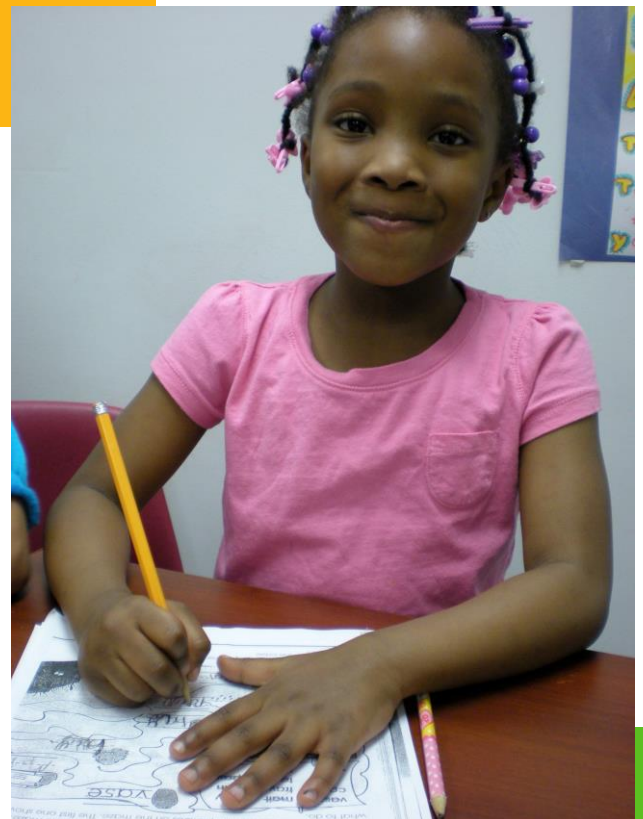

Afterschool Programming

At Girls Inc. your girl will participate in a wide variety of activities each day and week. While schedules will vary, most days include three activities; informal time, program time, and homework time. The typical daily schedule is below.

Informal time is down time for girls, to relax from the school day, promote healthy habits of physical activity, and let girls build their social and emotional skills through free play.

Programming time is when girls participate in hands-on curriculum designed to supplement and enrich what girls are learning during the school day, and help them be strong, smart, and bold! Each semester girls will participate in three – four programs a different one each day of the week. These programs will vary by age group and semester but will include Literacy, STEM (science, technology, engineering, and Math), Economic Literacy, Social Conflict Resolution, and Media Literacy.

During Homework time girls focus on completing their homework for the day or doing another educational activity such as reading, writing or doing extra practice on skills. Facilitators and volunteers will be available to assist girls with homework. While facilitators cannot always provide individual attention to each girl, facilitators will strive to keep track of your girl's academic needs and provide her with support in this area.

In addition, each Friday we have “Fun Friday” often with special guests and fun education activities such as crafts or games. We also provide early dismissal programming and full day programming on some days when school is closed.

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Afterschool Transportation

All Marietta City Elementary Schools will drop girls off at our center for the afterschool program on the school bus. Girls Inc. will pick up girls from a limited number of local Cobb County and Charter Elementary Schools. The program is also open to girls in K - 8th grade at the schools listed below or a girl who can be dropped off at the center if they are homeschooled or at a school outside our service area.

The following list is subject to change due to the number of girls registered for our Afterschool Program. We cannot pick up at a school if there are not enough girls from that school registered – i.e. we cannot pick up at a school for only one girl even if it is a school listed below.

Afterschool Tuition

\$50 registration fee due at the time of registration

Tuition is \$500 per semester, once registered you are committing to attend for the entire semester. The fall semester is August to December, and spring semester is January to May. For your convenience, your semester tuition can be paid as **\$100 per month** due before or on the 1st of the month.

Please note this does mean that some months there is more programming than others (March provides more program hours than May) however because it's a semester fee that's broken into monthly payments the monthly payments for both months are the same. Payments cannot be pro-rated or refunded for time not at the center. This is due to the costs associated with holding a space for your girl as well as consistency of payments helps keep administrative costs low!

We have a limited number of scholarships available based on need. To apply for a scholarship, simply check the scholarship box on the application (Application Page 4).

Registration Requirements

All of the following items are required in order for your registration to be complete. We apologize for any inconvenience the additional documentation adds. It is required due to our government funding, which enables us to keep your costs low.

- **Complete Application Packet for each participant**
- **Most recent report card (end of last school year)**
- **\$50 Registration Fee for each participant**
- **Proof of Residency for primary Parent/Guardian (ex: Photo ID or check stub with proper Address, utility bill or mortgage/rent which lists address)**
- **Copies of photo IDs for all household members over the age of 18**
- **Copies of Social Security card for all household members 6 and older**
- **Proof of all household income for persons over the age of 18 (ex: 6 to 8 current and consecutive check stubs, signed letter from employer on company letterhead, TANF records, food stamps, free and reduced lunch verification, alimony/child support, unemployment & disability income, armed forces income, pension/retirement income)**
- **If there is no-income in the household, you must complete a notarized Self-Certification form or if you are self-employed you will need to complete a Self-Employment Certification form.** Self-Certification forms are available at Girls Inc. and a staff member is available to notarize documents Monday-Friday 2:30pm-6:00pm.

We are able to use previous copies of social security cards or photo IDs for girls who have been registered in other center programs in the last year. We must receive an updated version of the other documents.

Your registration is not complete, and your spot will not be held until we have received your completed application packet and your registration fee, this includes ALL supporting documentation.

You may pay your registration fee in cash, money order, check, debit card, or credit card in person or through PayPal on our website at www.girlsincatl.org.

Attendance

You are responsible for informing us if your participant will be absent on any given day. Please **call and inform Girls Inc. of absences no later than 12:00 PM**. When you do not notify us that your child will be absent we waste significant time during pick up that causes confusion and can result in your child being made to wait for longer periods at school!

Parents/Guardians or authorized pick-ups are required to come **in the building and sign participants out no later than 6:30pm** each day. Only people listed in this packet will be allowed to pick up the participant, and people picking up girls will be asked to show ID.

Please note that homework time is 5pm-6pm. If you pick your child up early they may not have adequate time to work on their homework. We recommend picking up your girl between 6 & 6:30pm to give them maximum homework time.

Illness and Medication

Girls Inc. is not equipped to care for sick children. All Girls Inc. Program Facilitators are First Aid and CPR certified, however they have no other medical training. If a girl is unable to participate in the normal routine, the parent/guardian will be called and must come pick up the child. If a primary parent/guardian cannot be reached, Girls Inc. will contact alternate contacts provided for pick-up. Participants are not allowed to come to Girls Inc. Afterschool Program if they have not attended school that day due to illness or if they currently have or, in the last 12 hours, have had a 1) fever greater than 100 degrees, 2) serious diarrhea or vomiting, 3) a contagious rash or illness, 4) obvious pain or discomfort and/or 5) head lice. Some illnesses such as pink eye may require a doctor's notice that your child is no longer contagious to return to Girls Inc.

Any medications girls must take while at Girls Inc. must have written directions and signed authorization from a parent/guardian. Medication must be in its original container with an unaltered label containing the child's name and the date. Medication will be stored in the front office while at the Girls Inc. center and will go with staff on field trips.

Belongings & Coming Prepared

Participants are expected to come prepared for all activities that take place at Girls Inc. Participants will not be allowed to remove shoes for activities, and if they are not appropriately dressed, they will not get to participate. Girls Inc. of Greater Atlanta is not responsible for any lost or stolen items including but not limited to money or electronics. Girls in our elementary afterschool program are not allowed to use cell phones or electronic devices while at the afterschool program.

Behavior

Girls Inc. promotes self-discipline and works to create rules and structure that help each girl feel safe and secure and ensure all girls show respect to each other, staff, volunteers and the space. We also try to focus on incentives for positive behavior. When participants break rules, they are reminded of the expectations at Girls Inc. and discuss their behavior with staff, or take a short time away to calm down. Often this is all that is necessary.

Participants can also be given consequences designed to change future behavior such as writing down what they could do differently next time. Behavior issues on field trips may result in not being able to participate in future field trips as field trip environments often pose more risk. For behavioral issues a white slip will be sent home to parents to inform them of the issue and what is being done to address it. For repeated or more severe behavior issues a pink slip will be sent home. *If the behavior continues beyond this point, or if at any time a participant's behavior causes significant damage to or puts themselves, other participants, staff, or volunteers at risk, Girls Inc. of Greater Atlanta withholds the right to dismiss a participant from the program.*

Evaluation

Girls Inc. of Greater Atlanta is dedicated to providing high quality, intentional programming that moves girls forward to become strong, smart and bold women. To continue improving our programming to meet these goals, we utilize a number of different tools to evaluate the effectiveness of our programs. In addition, information from these evaluations is used to secure additional funding for our programs which help keep costs low for our parents.

These tools include pre- and post-surveys taken by participants to measure content knowledge such as a skills survey of what they learned in an Economic Literacy class. We may use an evaluation to measure a girls' progress in reading, or by using your child's report card to see how we can make our program better in academic support. In addition, we use a questionnaire called the Survey of Afterschool Youth Outcomes (SAYO) to look at youth's participation in afterschool activities and measures engagement in the program.

These outcomes may also be measured by collecting materials produced by girls over the course of the summer. In addition, our staff will make observations regarding participants' skills, attitudes and knowledge and how they change over time. All evaluation materials, such as surveys, will be kept confidential. Any reporting done will be at the group level (i.e. 80% of girls...). Individual results will not be shared.

Payment Policies

Non-Refundable Policy: The Afterschool Membership Fee of \$50 is Non-refundable. No refund will be granted to any member for a month of programming who withdraws or is dismissed for any behavioral reason. NO refund will be provided due to student absences or school closure due to bad weather.

Late Payment Policy: Each month's tuition payment is due by the 1st of the month. You will be given a 3-day grace period to make this payment. **Any payments received after the 3rd of the month will be assessed a \$2 per business day late fee.** For example, if you were to pay one week late you would owe a \$10 late fee for the 5 business days you paid late. If the tuition and late payments are not made your participant will not be allowed to continue attending the Girls Inc. Afterschool program.

Late Pickup: Girls Inc. closes at 6:30 PM. Late pickup fees begin to accrue at 6:35 PM, after which you will be assessed a fee of \$1.00 for every minute you are late. Late pickup fees are due within one week of when they are incurred. In the event of consistent late pick-ups, or extremely late pick-ups Girls Inc. reserves the right to increase fees or even dismiss participants from the program.

Returned Checks: If a check you have written for program fees is returned from the bank, **you will be charged a \$25 returned check fee** which will be due within one week of notification. In addition, we will require you to make all payments to Girls Inc. through cash, money order or cashier's check for six months following the returned personal check.

The goal of the Girls Inc. Afterschool program is to move girls forward in the areas of making healthy choices, achieving academically and learning necessary life skills. Please know that while academic achievement is one of our primary goals our priority is providing high quality, educational opportunities through hands-on activities. We do have homework time each day and do our best to provide as much support as possible – however homework completion is not the primary focus of this program. We do want to ensure that our program is focus on the areas that matter most to you and your child, so please let us know your priorities below.
